

YOUR ATTENTION PLEASE

Iowa State University, Peterson Contractors Inc. (PCI – general contractor), and Controlled Demolition, Inc. (CDI – implosion subcontractor) would like you to be aware that Storms Hall and Knapp Hall are scheduled to be demolished by implosion the week of July 18, 2005.

Implosion is a process in which small amounts of explosives are used to disrupt selected supports in a building. This allows gravity to pull the structure down in a controlled manner. CDI has used this implosion method thousands of times around the world in the past 52 years to remove unwanted structures. CDI's safety record is unparalleled in the industry.

There are three (3) points that we would like to make you aware of:

1. Dust is an unpreventable by-product of all kinds of demolition. Iowa State, PCI, and CDI would like to advise you that there will be heavy dust in the blocks immediately surrounding the demolition site. With a wrecking ball, the building is slowly broken up releasing dust over several months. With implosion, the same overall quantity of dust is released over several seconds, and may linger in the general area for 4 to 6 minutes. Depending on wind speed and direction on the day of the implosion, the dust may or may not reach your properties. As a precautionary measure, we recommend that you close all windows, doors and air intakes, and cover any other openings that might allow dust to enter your apartment, house or building. We also recommend that you turn off all exhaust fans before or at the time of the implosion, as these may draw air into your building through cracks in the walls and windows. If you find dust uncomfortable or irritating, or if you have any respiratory conditions that would be aggravated by dust, please stay indoors during the demolition. The university will be providing beverages and implosion viewing via television at the Frederiksen Court Community Center (Hawthorn Market). The experts advise us that the television feeds will be superior to watching the event in person.
2. Early on the morning of the implosion, ISU Police and the Ames Police Department will set up an exclusion zone around the buildings. This is to prevent people from getting too close. We need your cooperation with the police to ensure everyone's safety. For those persons inside the exclusion zone, we ask that you cooperate with police and contractors. Everything they communicate or ask of you is to minimize inconvenience and/or to promote safety. The exclusion zone includes the properties outlined below:



We ask that occupants within the exclusion zone leave the property on the morning of the implosion.

3. For your safety, traffic will be restricted in and around the Campustown area and the exclusion zone. Hayward Avenue will be closed between Mortensen Road and Knapp Street; Welch Avenue will be closed South of Knapp Street; Stanton Avenue will be closed south of Baker Street; Lynn Avenue will be closed South of Baker; and Storm and Donald Streets will be closed west of Ash Avenue.
